

## Conservation Biology & Economics in the Amazon jungle

- Spend part of August in Ecuador's Amazon jungle, one of the most biodiverse places on earth (tentatively 8/1 departure).
- Study the controversy surrounding oil exploration in the jungle through the lenses of both science and economics.
- Study tropical rainforest ecology and unique Amazon plants and animals...monkeys, birds, insects, reptiles, and some very rare species such as the pink river dolphin.
- Conduct field work & learn about sustainability projects.
- Meet with indigenous tribes to learn how drilling impacts their lives; learn indigenous medicine from a shaman.
- ◆ Visit the equator and an indigenous artisan community.
- BIOL/ENSC 495 in Ecuador "Conservation Biology and Economics: The Oil Debate in Ecuador"...and it <u>waives Goal 9</u>.
- ◆ There is <u>no prerequisite</u> for the course.
- Course starts online and then continues in Ecuador, meaning more time for excursions and activities.
